loving nature and the promise of a better world founded on hope, justice, peace, and a true God given identity. The nativity helps us throw away what isn't important and remember what is. Jesus' family chose a stable: it contained what they needed and nothing more. Let's lose the distractions and remember God's plan for us.

We all realised that this was for real. No textbooks, no jotters. It wasn't just a


made up story written on a sheet of paper.
