Why veil the cross and other images during Passiontide? As Christ hid himself from the rage of the Jewish authorities (St John 8:59), so now He is hidden from the world in preparation for the mysteries of His passion. In His passion, our Saviour's divinity was almost totally eclipsed, so great was His suffering. Likewise, even His humanity was obscured – so much so that He could say through His prophet: *I am a worm and no man* (Psalm 21:7). His face and whole body were so disfigured by the blows and scourges that our Jesus was scarcely recognizable! Thus, the wounds He endured hid both His divinity and His humanity. For this reason, we veil the crosses in these final days of Lent – hiding our Saviour under the sad purple cloth.
