



3rd SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME (A)

First reading: Isaiah 9:1b-4

Psalm Response:


The Lord is my light and my salvation.

Second reading: 1 Corinthians 1: 10-13, 17

Acclamation:

*Jesus proclaimed the gospel of the kingdom
and healed every affliction among the people.*

Gospel: Matthew 4: 12-23



This Sunday's readings remind us that God is always inviting people to move forward: from darkness into light, from being unsure to trusting, and from everyday life into following Jesus.

In the first reading, Isaiah speaks about people who have been walking in darkness and suddenly see a great light. This tells us something important about God: when people feel lost, worried, or forgotten, God does not turn away. Instead, God brings light right into those difficult moments. Even when life feels hard, God is already at work.

In the Gospel, we see this promise come alive in Jesus. He begins by saying, "*Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.*" This doesn't mean we should be afraid. It means turning towards God and choosing a better way to live. When Jesus meets the fishermen, he calls them just as they are, in the middle of their normal day. They leave their nets behind and follow him, not because they know exactly what will happen, but because they trust him.

Saint Paul reminds us that following Jesus also affects how we treat one another. He asks the community to stop arguing and to live in unity. Being followers of Jesus means choosing kindness, forgiveness, and working together — especially when it's not easy. These readings invite us to think together as families: what might Jesus be asking us to let go of? It could be unkind words, bad habits, or fears that stop us from loving others well. God's light is already shining, and Jesus is already calling us.

As we gather this Sunday, may we listen for Jesus' voice in our homes, our schools, our work, and our friendships — and take small, brave steps to follow him each day.
